## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

**QUARTERBACKS** - Coming into '05 Michael Robinson was a 5th year senior, who had 7 career starts at RB, 6 at QB and 5 at WR. He had thrown for 1,181 yards in 3 years and was in the slash role. Many fans had anticipated that Anthony Morelli (PS#6) would start and Robinson would stay at WR. Paterno opted to use the spread offense and Robinson showed off his tremendous athletic ability. He threw for 2,350 (52.1%) with a 17-10 ratio (932 rush) and was the Big Ten MVP (#4DC SF). Morelli won the job in 2006 & 2007 but had a rocky career despite throwing for 2,651 (58.2%) with a 19-10 ratio in '07. His backup Darryll Clark showed some promise in the '07 Alamo Bowl rushing for 50 on QB draws. Last year Clark battled soph Pat Devlin (PS#5). The job was rated as a toss-up but Clark won it and had a 1st Tm B10 year throwing for 2,592 (59.8%) with a 19-6 ratio (#3 rusher). Devlin led the game winning TD drive vs OSU when Clark was KO'd with a concussion. Devin hit 10 of 25 of 47 for 459 but opted to transfer (Delaware) prior to the bowl. Paterno brings in Kevin Newsome (PS#10) who played at Hargrave and was in for the spring. Not listed below are Shane McGregor (6'1" 216 rFr) and John Kelly (6'1" 203 rFr). Clark should improve in his 2nd year.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In 2007 Rodney Kinlaw became the 11th Lion to top 1,000 rushing with 1,329 (5.5). RFr Evan Royster (PS#18) was the power back rushing for 513 (solid 6.3 ypc). Last year they had to replace Kinlaw and Royster worked to improve his speed over the summer. RFr Stephon Green (PS#145DB), who has 4.29 spd, was expected to be a steady compliment to Royster and he rushed for 578 (5.5) before being inj in the bowl. Royster rushed for 1,236 (solid 6.5) despite being injured late in the 1Q of the bowl. He led the FBS in ypc after 9 games. Brent Carter (6'2" 219 Jr, PS#94) had 129 (5.9) in 7 games before an ACL. Not listed in the 3 deep below are Carter, Derek Day (5'9" 184 rFr), Larry Federoff (5'11" 236 Sr), Joe Suhey (6'1" 220 So, PS#155) and Shaine Thompson (6'0" 214 So). The only loss is FB Dan Lawlor (4 st, 13 yd). This is one of the top RB units in the country.

**RECEIVERS** - In 2005 Paterno brought in an excellent class of true frosh including Derrick Williams (PS#1DB) but a pair of less highly touted frosh stepped to the forefront as walk-on rFr Deon Butler led with 691 (18.7) and true frosh Jordan Norwood was #2 with 422 (13.2). Those 3 WR's were the top 3 receivers in all 4 of their seasons. Butler (#3DC SEA) departs as PSU's all-time career rec leader and led in '08 with 47 (17.2). Williams (#3DC DET) was PSU's MVP last year with his outstanding returns and added 485 (11.0). Norwood was #2 with 637 (15.5). Naturally

this year all 3 depart and the top returnees are Brett Brackett (6'6", PS#37) who had 160 (12.3) and Graham Zug who had 174 (15.8). TE Andrew Quarless had 117 (10.6). Not listed in the 3 deep below are JD Mason (6'4" 208 rFr), Larry Ryland (5'6" 171 rFr), Ryan Scherer (5'8" 169 rFr), Andrew Goodman (6'0" 183 rFr), Stephen Joseph (6'0" 184 So) and TE's Gino Raneri (6'3" 239 rFr), Mark Wedderburn (6'6" 225 rFr) and Brennan Coakley (6'4" 235 Sr, PS#149). Naturally with the loss of their top 3 WR's who combined for 116 car st, 466 rec, 6,107 yd, 44 TD and 61% of the team's receiving yards, this unit is weaker.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In 2007 the Lions had 2.5 starters back and improved to 194 ypg rush (4.8) while allowing 20 sacks. LT Gerald Cadogan even shutdown the NCAA's sack leader (IN's Greg Middleton). Last year they had to replace 4 players who combined for just 4 starts (93.8% starts ret). As you would expect, with a more mobile QB in the spread offense and a veteran O-line the numbers improved to 206 ypg rush (5.2) while allowing just 13 sacks (3.4%). This year they lose Rimington Award winner and 1st Tm AA CQ Shipley (B10 OL Yr, 13 st, 3Y st'r, #7DC PIT), LT Cadogan (1st Tm B10, 13 st, 2Y st'r), 3rd Tm AA LG Rich Ohrnberger (1st Tm B10, 13 st, 3Y st'r, #4DC NE) and G Mike Lucian (1 st). G Stefan Wisniewski (PS#25) moves to C. They do have 8 VHT's in the 2 deep and average 6'4" 303 but are less experienced than '08.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - Penn St always has a tough rush D and in '06 they had to replace 3 starters who were a #1 NFL DC, a 1st Tm AA and a 1st Tm B10 honoree. Amazingly they allowed just 87 ypg (2.8). In '07 they had to replace 3 starters (#3, #5 DC) and 2 backups but still allowed just 94 ypg (2.7) and were #2 in the FBS in sacks with 46. Last spring DL coach Johnson called it his best unit in 15 years but they lost 2 DT's (comb 12 st, 57 tk) over the summer. Also '07's 1st Tm B10 DE Maurice Evans (12.5 sk '07) was susp early and started just 4. They allowed 93 ypg (2.8) but the sacks did drop to 33 even with the emergence of Aaron Maybin (12 sk, 1st Tm AA). This year both Maybin (10 st, 49 tk, #1DC BUF) and Evans (34 tk) left early for the NFL and also gone is DT Josh Gaines (12 st, 31 tk, 4 sk, 1 int, HM B10). Not listed in the PSL are Brandon Ware (6'3" 347 rFr) and Jonathan Stewart (6'2" 247 So). This may be the deepest the Lions have been at DT in a long time with 7 quality players. They also add a VHT who I think will do well at DE. While less exp than '08, they don't lose as much as in '06 and '07 and should be another top-notch group.

**LINEBACKERS** - Penn St is known as "Linebacker U" but surprisingly after having 2 LB's selected in the 2000 draft went through a streak of 6 straight years without one until Paul Posluszny was a #2 in '07. In '06 Posluszny, Dan Connor and Sean Lee were #1, #2 and #3 in tackles with 319 combined (nearly 40% of the team's total) and the 3 backups were all VHT's (PS#s 17, 18 and 21). In '07 they had to replace Posluszny (1st Tm AA) but had 5 of the top 6 back. Connor led with 145 and Lee had 138. Last year they had to replace Connor (#3DC) and then Lee (proj #1DC) tore his ACL in spring so they only returned a #6 tackler and the unit was the question mark of the defense. Navro Bowman (PS#16) erased those doubts by living up to his VHT billing and earning 1st Tm B10 honors, even tying the Rose Bowl record with 5 tfl. Josh Hull filled in for Lee at MLB and was #2 tackler. This year they lose HM B10 Tyrell Sales (11 st, 68 tk, 2.5 tfl, 1 int) but not only have 5 of the top 6 back, they also get the return of Lee. Not listed below are James Van Fleet (6'0" 217 rFr), Michael Zordich (6'1" 229 rFr, PS#15) and Brian Irvin (6'3" 224 rFr). Josh Matzkin (6'0" 223 Jr) and Ken Pollock (6'0" 208 rFr). An amazing 10 of the top 11 are VHT's making this one of the top LB units in the country.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - PSU has had 5 Top 10 finishes in my pass D rankings in the last 12 years. In '06 they had to replace all 4 starters and just missed (#16). In '07 three starters ret'd and it was shocking that the Lions dropped to #70. Last year they had to replace one starter (#4DC) and as you would expect, the Lions moved to #24 allowing a 10-16 ratio. This year they lose 1st Tm

B10 Anthony Scirrotto (12 st, 61 tk, 2 int), 2nd Tm B10 CB Lydell Sargeant (11 st, 33 tk, 4 int), HM B10 10 CB Tony Davis (13 st, 46 tk, 1 int) and HM B10 S Mark Rubin (13 st, 60 tk, 2 int). Not listed below are Shelton McCullough (6'0" 193 Jr), Sean Luchnick (6'0" 192 rFr), Evan Lewis (5'10" 175 rFr), Tyler Ahrenhold (6'0" 175 So) and Jacob Fagnano (6'0" 198 rFr). This is a unit where I would expect some true frosh to play immediately and it is my biggest concern on the '09 squad. Perhaps they can duplicate '06's (0 st back) performance (#16).

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - The Lions finished #17 in my ST rankings in '06 led by PR Derrick Williams (12.0) and KR AJ Wallace (24.2). K Kevin Kelly hit 22 of 34 (3 miss 50+) They had to replace P Kapinos (36.4 net) in '07 and slipped to #36. Kevin Kelly hit 20 of 26 FG's (long 53'). New P Jeremy Boone had a net of 39.4 (#3 NCAA). Last year the unit ret intact and as you would expect, PSU improved to #4. The top KR's were Williams (25.8) and 1 TD and Chaz Powell (28.8) while Williams also had a PR TD (9.4). Kevin Kelly hit 20 of 24 FG's (long 52) and had 15 TB on KO. Boone avg 43.0 (37.9 tm net). This year they must replace Kelly and Williams and while Paterno should fashion a good unit, they figure to drop some.

**COACHES** - Joe Paterno entered 2003 as the IA all-time career win leader but was passed by FSU's Bobby Bowden (373) after the season. Paterno is back on top and leading Bowden by 1 going into '09. Paterno is already in the College Football Hall of Fame and defeated Bowden in 2005's Orange Bowl earning 2005 AP Coach of the Year. Paterno has won 2 Nat'l Titles but four other times has finished undefeated. He has won more bowls than any other coach (23) and has moved past Amos Alonzo Stagg for the longest HC tenure at one school. The OC since 2004 is Galen Hall who was the HC at Florida (1984-'89). The DC is Tom Bradley who is in his 31st year, 10th as DC. Since 1966 when Paterno took over, there have been 832 IA coaching changes.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

I would have to classify Penn St's 9-4 2007 season as a disappointment. They had a 427-336 yd edge at Illinois but had 4 key TO's and lost and they had a 24-7 lead vs Mich St in the 3Q but lost and were relegated to the Alamo Bowl. Paterno even said, "We should have been 10-2." While Penn St was just 4-4 in Big Ten play they were #2 in ypg (+38.1) and last year moved back to the spread offense that they used in their magical Big Ten Championship '05 season. PSU was #7 in the FBS in rush D for an amazing 3rd straight year in '07 and was 2nd in the nation in sacks (46). Last year despite losing their top LB Sean Lee to injury, they had 16 ret starters. Surprisingly LY PSU was not among the Top 3 in the Big Ten preseason poll and I had the only publication in the country to have the Lions ranked in the Top 10 at the start of the year. Out of the 14 sources documented by stassen.com, five did not even have the Lions RANKED and they were just #22 in the AP preseason poll. PSU started the year in dominant fashion dealing opponents their worst losses of the season almost every week. Two and a half weeks prior to Ore St beating USC, they were manhandled by PSU 45-14. Ohio St needed a late TD to get past Wisc by 3. The very next week PSU traveled to Madison and destroyed the Badgers 48-7. They overcame a huge test at Ohio St with a 7 point win, their only close win of the year. It was a game of missed opportunities vs Iowa. In the 1H PSU had 3 long drives result in just 13 pts while Iowa got a short TD drive set up after PSU punted from their own 1. PSU led 23-14 in the 4Q but ended up losing with a questionable 3rd & 15 pass interference call keeping alive an Iowa drive. They needed to beat #17 Mich St (who came in 6-1 in the Big Ten) for the Big Ten Title and Rose Bowl bid and they destroyed the Spartans 49-18. They took on a powerful USC team on basically its home field and the Trojans led 31-7 at the half. PSU twice had a chance to make it a 7 pt game but lost by 14. PSU was tops in the Big Ten in ypg in conf play (+124.1) but this is a much less exp team with just 9 ret starters. On the positive side, they were #16 in the FBS in starts lost to inj (38) making them more experienced than their numbers suggest and they do get the return of their top def player (Lee). Five of my 9 sets of power ratings call for Penn St to go unbeaten this year and once again the Nov 7th matchup vs OSU may be for the Big Ten Title.

Penn St has won 7 straight season openers & 2 were vs Akron (34-16, '06 & 48-10, '04). PSU last hosted Akron on a soaked field in '06 (remnants of Hurricane Ernesto).  
PSU is 22-3 vs Syracuse S/'67 but LY's 55-13 win was 1st since joining the Big Ten ('93). The Lions finished with 560-159 yd & 26-8 FD edges & led 38-6 at halftime.  
The Lions are 34-3-1 all-time but 33-0-1 since 1943. Penn St has faced Temple 3 straight years winning by a combined 123-3. Last year they had a 546-138 yd edge.  
PSU is just 1-6 vs Iowa S/'00 & last yr went into Iowa City ranked #3. Penn St led 24-13 in the 4Q before allowing a 57/12pl drive & a 31 yd FG with :01 left to lose by 1.  
PSU is only 3-6 in Big Ten road openers. Penn St is 13-3 vs Illinois but lost last time in Champaign. Last year Derrick Williams had 241 all-purp yds & 3 TD's.  
Since joining the Big Ten ('93) PSU has played only 2 FCS schools beating YSU 37-3 ('06) & CCar 66-10 LY. The Panthers went 5-7 LY including losses to C Mich & Illinois.  
Penn St is just 2-4 the L/6 vs Minnesota including 1-2 at home. PSU did win last meeting (28-27 in OT, '06). The team that has rushed for more yards has won the last 5.  
Penn St trailed Mich 17-7 before scoring the final 39 pts. That snapped a Paterno record 9 game series losing streak & set a PSU series record with 46 pts scored.

PSU stayed undefeated (12-0) vs Indiana with LY's 34-7 win. They have won the last 5 at home by an avg of 26 ppg. Last yr they held the Hoosiers to 180 yds & 6 FD's.  
PSU is 7-2 vs MSU S/'00 but 2-4 the L/6 in East Lansing. LY PSU held MSU RB Ringer to a ssn low (42 yds). Fifteen of the L/16 seasons PSU has ended the reg ssn playing MSU.  
Bonus: Since 1990, Penn St is 18-1 in Beaver Stadium finales (lost to Mich, '99).
